October 18 – 31, 2007

Highlight on Pollinators in American Indian Art – showcasing arts with butterflies, bees, bats, hummingbirds and other pollinators as well as arts depicting the flowers and plants that are pollinated. Arts include basketry, beadwork, jewelry, pottery, sculpture, weavings and much more. This show will compliment the Interior Museum's exhibit *The Bats and the Bees: Pollination Systems in America*, on exhibit through March of 2008.

November 15 – 30, 2007

Carvings by Alaska Native artists – highlighting Yupik and Inupiat walrus tusk ivory and whale bone carvings. Walruses, seals, polar bears and arctic whales are favorite subjects, along with birds, otters, woolly mammoths, wolves and moose. A limited selection of baleen and Alaskan grass baskets will be available as well.

December 13 – 15, 2007

Innovators in American Indian Jewelry -- highlighting works from extraordinary contemporary artists working in sterling silver and gold and an array of stones and materials. Meet guest artist, Pat Bedonie (Navajo) each day from 1 – 4pm.
